The Galveston County Fair and Rodeo is back after a two year hiatus and will run April 22 to April 30.

The nine-day event will offer livestock shows, rodeo events, traditional fair food favorites, the carnival, various Fair contests and both the Seafood and Barbecue Cookoff competitions. It all takes place at Jack Brooks Park in Hitchcock at 5700 FM 2004 and State Highway 6.

In 2020, the fair was cancelled due to the pandemic and modified the next year.

Six musical performances are planned. The Spazmatics will kickoff the fair with their favorite 1980s selections at 9 pm Friday, April 22.

Houston native, singer and songwriter Robert Earl Keen will perform April 23. Drew Fish will open for Keen at 8:30 pm.

Rock and roll favorite Bag of Donuts will

return to the fair Friday April 29 at 10 pm.

As part of his current nationwide tour, Jon Stork will perform Saturday, April 30 with Cody Wayne as his opening act at 8:30 pm.

Daily family activities include a Texan pet-

ting zoo, Kids Pedal Tractor Pull, Carnival, Farmer's Corral, shopping and food.

Tickets vary in price for the different days. Military and children 5 and under are free every day.

The Galveston County Fair and Rodeo Inc. is a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization whose purpose is to serve the youth of Galveston County by promoting youth, education and agriculture and supporting 4-H and FFA programs.

The fair was held for the first time in 1938 at Runge Park in Arcadia. It moved to Jack Brooks Park in Hitchcock in the 1980s. The organization provided scholarships each year to high school seniors in Galveston County. In 2021 donations to the fair enabled the organization to provide \$47,000 in scholarships.

Lone Star Flight Museum to host Hall of Fame inductees

The Lone Star Flight Museum invites everyone to the Texas Aviation Hall of Fame ceremony and luncheon planned for Friday, April 22 from 11:30 am to 1 pm.

Bruce A. Bohannon, Dr. Bernard A. Harris, Jr., Marion P. Jayne, and General Mark A. Welsh III (ret) will be inducted as the Class of 2022. This year also marks the 25th anniversary of the establishment of the TAHOF.

An aviation legend, record setter and inspiring instructor, Bruce Bohannon is from Alvin. With a passion for flight from a very young age, he soloed at 16, cut his teeth flying crop dusters, became an acrobatic pilot, flight instructor, air racer and aviation record setter.

Bohannon raced his aircraft, "Pushy Galore" between 1989 and 1998 winning numerous races and setting many records before retiring it to the Experimental Aircraft Association Museum in Oshkosh, WI. He set thirty more records between 1999 and 2005 in "The Exxon Flyin' Tiger." The *Tiger* was built for setting time to climb and altitude records. As of 2006, it was the fastest climbing piston-engine aircraft at various heights.

Having set 35 World Performance Records, Bohannon is the only pilot ever awarded the prestigious "Louis Bleriot Medal" by the Federation Aeronautique Internationale three years in a row, in 2001, 2002, & 2003. He currently owns and operates Flyin' Tiger Flying School in Angleton and inspires pilots of all ages.

Born in Temple, Texas, Dr. Bernard Harris Jr. is a former NASA astronaut who on February 9, 1995, became the first African American astronaut to walk in space and logged more than 438 hours and traveled over 7.2 million miles on two space shuttle missions. He was a mission specialist on the space shuttle Columbia in 1993 and a payload commander on space shuttle Discovery in 1995.

Harris' commitment began early on in his life and after earning a Doctor of Medicine from Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Medicine, he completed a residency in internal medicine at the Mayo Clinic, a National Research Council Fellowship in endocrinology at the NASA Ames Research Center and trained as a flight surgeon at the United States Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine.

Philanthropy, education and inspiring young people have always been a priority for Harris. He founded the Harris Institute & Foundation and is the current CEO of the National Math and Science Initiative organization. Dr. Harris is also CEO and managing partner of Vesalius Ventures, Inc., and serves on several boards across various

industries.

Marion P. Jayne is recognized on six continents for world records, pioneering achievements, entrepreneurial innovations, and encouragement of women to be successful in the field of aviation. She is the only U.S. pilot to race her airplane in two competitions around the world. Marion and her daughter Patricia Jayne Keefer won the 1994 Round the World Air Race in her Piper Twin Comanche and received the Federation Aeronautique Internationale Gold Medal.

Jayne holds the record for the most cross-country speed air race victories and soloed a Mooney across the Atlantic Ocean in the early 1980s and in 1990 in a vintage 1949 V-tail Bonanza.

She amassed many air racing awards including induction into the Women In Aviation International Hall of Fame and being named as one of 100 Aviation Heroes at the First Century of Flight Kitty Hawk Celebration in 2003. She left an inspirational legacy that all things are possible.

General Mark A. Welsh III (ret) was the 20th Chief of Staff of the U.S. Air Force. Born in San Antonio, he was commissioned in June 1976 upon graduation from the Air Force Academy and led a distinguished 40-year career spanning numerous operational, command and staff positions. As a pilot, General Welsh flew more than 3,300 hours in the F-16, A-10, T-37 and TG7A earning two Distinguished Flying Crosses as a combat pilot in Desert Storm.

Welsh served as Commander of U.S. Air Forces in Europe, as the Associate Director for Military Affairs of the Central Intelligence Agency, and as the Vice Commander of Air Education and Training Command, and other leadership roles in his career.

Named Chief of Staff of the U.S. Air Force in 2012, Welsh served as the senior uniformed Air Force officer responsible 660,000 active-duty, Guard, Reserve and civilian forces serving in the U.S. and overseas. As a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, he served as a military adviser to the Secretary of Defense and the President. He retired from the military in 2016 and now serves as Dean of the Bush School of Government and Public Service at Texas A&M University.

The Texas Aviation Hall of Fame was established in 1995 through a resolution by the 74th Texas Legislature and signed by then Gov. George W. Bush, to honor famous aviators who are Texans and famous Texans who are aviators. There are currently 80 individual members represented in four categories: Trailblazers & Explorers, Military Aviators, Innovators & Entrepreneurs and Leaders.

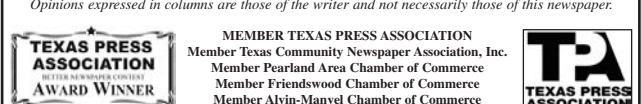

Last week, Pearland run-ruled Alief Taylor (16-0) and Alief Hastings (15-0) to improve to 9-1 with two games remaining in league play.

There is nothing to fear

There was a time in American history that the American people were living in fear. They weren't afraid of an enemy invading our country. The fact is the invasion was from within. Fear of poverty. Fear of disease. Fear of death. Fear of failure.

One day I was speaking to some students and I was encouraging them to take risks. One of the students looked at me and said, "But what if we fail?" And I replied, "Whoever said you were a success?"

We all face the fear of failure. It is part of our nature. Franklin D. Roosevelt addressed the nation with these words, "There is nothing to fear, but fear itself."

I would suggest that we need to make a friend of our fear. Many books written on the subject of fear are nothing more than delightful little treatises on how to get rid of fear, or how to master or conquer our fear.

What most people haven't figured out is that fear is not our enemy, an evil and harmful emotion to be completely driven out. You will not win if you start from there; you never come out right from a false start.

Fear is an elemental emotion, a part of our native equipment, God-given; therefore, like any other normal emotion, it has a constructive, essential purpose. Our real problem is not how to get rid of it, but how to use it to our advantage.

The animals are aware of its purpose. There is no animal without fear. For some, like the deer and the rabbit, fear is the sole weapon of defense; it is not an enemy, but an ally. Startle a rabbit and what happens? The sense of impending danger starts a nervous reaction which, quicker than you can say, "rabbit," shoots a powerful stimulant from his glands into his running apparatus, and he is gone with the wind...gone with the speed he could never manage without the stimulus of fear. Same with a deer.

Yet, fear of some things is indeed the beginning of wisdom! Did you know there are scores of phobias that all kinds of people have to face in life.

There is acrophobia (fear of height); claustrophobia (fear of closed places); agoraphobia (fear of open spaces); neophobia (fear of something new); photophobia (fear of lights); pathophobia (fear of disease); spermaphobia (fear of germs); ergophobia (fear of work), etc.

Not all people are defeated by their fears. Some are jolted by it into faith and courage. It is my belief that the fears we face in our lives is placed there to energize us to living by faith. Faith should overcome our fear.

Or, as someone has said of the emotional reactions of certain people, "If you don't tell them enough they go fishing; if you tell them too much they go crazy."

A good friend once said to me, "Faith is believing a thing is so, even though it is not so, in order for it to be so."

There are those who allow fear to place them in bondage. To steal their joy. To shake them up. To only see the negative. So what should we do?

Old friend Robert said, "Just keep looking up to the One who knows all about you and loves you. Trust me - it work!"

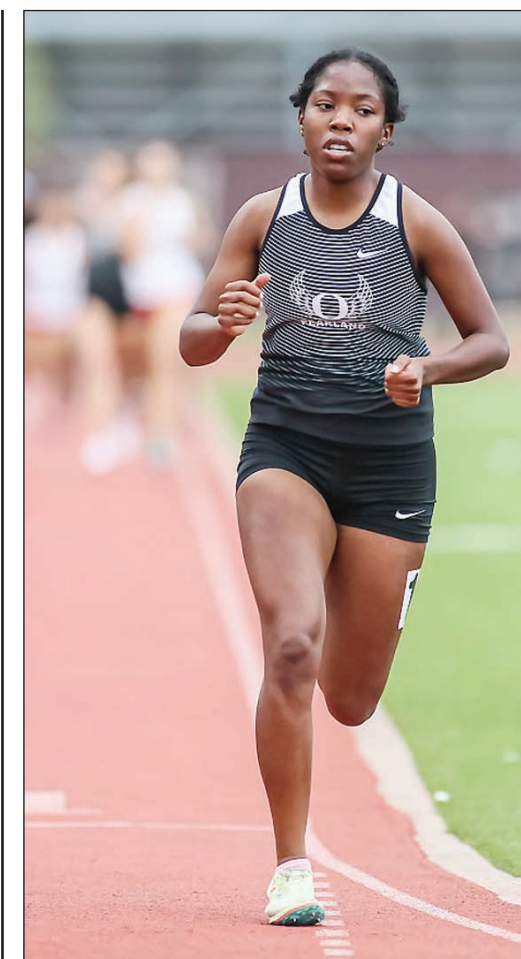

Four (4) and Six (6) and voting for or against proposed Charter Amendments, which will be set forth on the ballot substantially in the forms listed below:

PROPOSITION C

Amending Article III "City Council," Section 3.09 "Meetings of the City Council" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 3.09. Meetings of the City Council.

The City Council shall establish the days and times of its regular meetings but hold at least one regular meeting each month. Except during declared emergencies, all regular meetings of the City Council shall be held within the corporate limits of the City. All meetings of the council shall be open to the public, except as authorized by law.

PROPOSITION D

Amending Article III "City Council," Section 3.11 "Ordinances in general" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 3.11. Ordinances in general.

(a) Form. The Council shall legislate by ordinance only, and the enacting clause of every ordinance shall be: "Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Friendswood, State of Texas."

(b) Effective Date. Each proposed ordinance shall be introduced in written, electronic, or printed form and, upon passage, shall take effect at the time indicated therein; provided that any ordinance imposing a penalty, fine or forfeiture for a violation of its provisions shall become effective upon adoption or at a later time as specified in the ordinance.

(c) Readings. Ordinances that require one reading are those ordinances that: (1) require a public hearing or more notice than required by the Texas Open Meetings Act; (2) relate to the adoption or amendment to the budget; (3) relate to the assessment, levy, or collection of taxes; (4) relate to the calling of an election, or the canvassing of the returns and declaration of results of an election; (5) relate to the incurring of indebtedness, including, specifically, the issuance or sale of bonds or certificates of obligation; (6) relate to the development or improvement of a street; or (7) relate to an emergency so declared by Council.

For all other ordinances, including the franchise for a public utility, the caption shall be read at two council meetings on separate days. An ordinance requiring two readings shall be deemed rejected if approval on final reading is not obtained within 90 days of the date approval on first reading is obtained.

(d) Amendments/Printed Code. The City Council shall have power to cause the ordinances of the City to be corrected, amended, revised, codified, and printed in code form as often as the Council deems advisable, and such printed code, when adopted by the Council, shall be in full force and effect without the necessity of publishing the same or any part thereof in a newspaper. Such printed code shall be admitted in evidence in all courts and places without further proof.

PROPOSITION E

Amending Article IV "Administrative Services," Section 4.04 "City Secretary" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 4.04. City Secretary.

(a) Appointment. The City Manager shall appoint a City Secretary who shall act as the secretary to the Council and shall hold office at the pleasure of the City Manager. He/she shall be provided an office in the City Hall sufficient to maintain the records entrusted to his/her care and shall be entitled to a seat at the Council table at all official meetings.

(b) Duties of the City Secretary. The duties of the City Secretary shall be as follows:

- (1) Record the minutes of all official meetings of the Council; provided, however, only the captions of duly enacted ordinances and resolutions shall be recorded in the minutes.
(2) Be the custodian of all municipal records of the Council.
(3) Recommend to the Council rules and regulations to be adopted by ordinances to protect the safety and security of the municipal records.
(4) Hold and maintain the City seal and affix [it] to all instruments requiring such seal.
(5) Cause written notice of appointment to be delivered to each person appointed by the Mayor or Council to any board, commission, committee, or other appointive office or position, within five working days following such appointment by the Mayor or Council.
(c) Compensation. The City Manager shall set the compensation of the City Secretary.

PROPOSITION F

Amending Article V "Initiative, Referendum and Recall," Section 5.06 "Action on petitions," Subsection (b) "Submission to voters" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 5.06. Action on petitions.

(b) Submission to voters. The vote of the City on a proposed or referred ordinance shall be held at a Special Election called for such purpose in accordance with subsection (a)(3) above. Copies of the proposed or referred ordinance shall be made available at the City Secretary's Office and posted on the City's website 15 days immediately preceding the election.

PROPOSITION G

Amending Article VI "Nominations and Elections; Oath of Office," Section 6.04 "Canvassing and election results," Subsection (a) "Canvassing" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 6.04. Canvassing and election results.

Canvassing. Returns of the elections, general and special, shall be made by the election officers to the city council and the council shall canvass the returns and declare the results of such election in accordance with law.

PROPOSITION H

Amending Article VIII "Financial Administration," Section 8.03 "Annual budget," Subsection (a) "Content" and Subsection (c) "Public notice and hearing" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 8.03. Annual Budget.

(a) Content. The budget shall provide a complete financial plan of all City funds and activities and, except as required by law or this Charter, shall be in such form as the City Manager deems desirable or the Council may require. A budget message explaining the budget both in fiscal terms and in terms of the work programs shall be submitted with the budget. It shall outline the proposed financial policies of the City for the ensuing fiscal year, describe the important features of the budget, indicate any major changes from the current year in financial policies, expenditures, and revenues, with reasons for such changes. It shall also summarize the City's debt position and include such other material as the manager deems desirable. The budget shall begin with a clear general summary of its contents; shall show in detail all estimated income, the proposed property tax levy, and all proposed expenditures for the ensuing fiscal year, including debt service and an itemized estimate of the expense of conducting each department of the City. The proposed budget expenditures shall not exceed the total of estimated income. The budget shall be so arranged as to comply with state law.

(c) Public notice and hearing. Any public hearing on the proposed budget shall be held and published in accordance with law.

PROPOSITION I

Amending Article VIII "Financial Administration," Section 8.05 "Borrowing for capital improvements," Subsection (f) "Elections to authorize debt" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 8.05. Borrowing for Capital Improvements.

(f) Elections to authorize debt. Notwithstanding any other provision contained in this Section 8.05 to the contrary, the Council shall only issue debt pursuant to state law and shall be prohibited from issuing certificates of obligation without voter approval; provided, however, the Council shall be authorized to incur debt without the necessity of a Special Election if necessary due to an emergency or urgent public necessity, which emergency or urgent public necessity shall be expressed in the ordinance or resolution authorizing such debt.

PROPOSITION J

Amending Article IX "Franchises and Public Utilities," Section 9.10 "Public service corporations to file annual reports," Subsection (a) of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 9.10. Public service corporations to file annual reports.

(a) The Council may require all public service corporations operating within the corporate limits of the City to file a sworn annual report of the receipts from the operation of the said business for the current year, how expended, how much thereof for betterments or improvements, the rate of tolls or charges for services rendered to the public, and any other facts or information that the Council may deem pertinent for its use, including reports on operations within the City in intelligent passing upon any questions that may arise between the City and the said public service corporations; said reports to be filed with the City Secretary, and preserved for the use of the City Council. Such reports shall be reviewed annually by the Council to determine the propriety of the rates being charged.

PROPOSITION K

Amending Article XI "General provisions," Section 11.02 "City newspaper" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 11.02. City newspaper.

The Council shall, at a minimum, biennially designate a public newspaper of general circulation in the City as official publication thereof, and to continue as such until another is designated, and shall cause to be published therein all ordinances, notices and other matters required by this Charter, by the ordinances of the City, or by the Constitution and/or laws of the State of Texas to be published.

PROPOSITION A

Amending Article II "Powers of the City," Section 2.01 "General powers" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 2.01. General powers. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Charter, the City shall have all powers possible for a Home Rule city to have under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas as fully and completely as though they were expressly enumerated in this Charter, including the power to acquire property within Galveston, Harris, and Brazoria Counties.

PROPOSITION B

Amending Article III "City Council," Section 3.02 "Qualifications" of the Charter of the City of Friendswood, Texas, to read as follows:

Sec. 3.02. Qualifications. In addition to any other qualifications prescribed by law, the Mayor and each Councilmember shall be a qualified voter
