Pearland ISD celebrates Bet In honor of Better Hearing and Speech Month in May, Pearland Independent School District recognizes its professional speech-language pathologists (SLPs) for supporting the academic success of students
with hearing and communication challenges
Pearland ISD's 27 SLPs help prevent, identify, assess and treat speech and language problems that impact students' achievement.
"Speech-language pathologists work with people every day in settings that include schools, private practices, health care facilities and even their own homes to improve their speech, language, social and cognitive Kate Puna.
According to many SLPs, children today are at great risk of hearing loss from unsafe use of personal audio devices and exposure to noisy activities. Guidelines from the
World Health Organization recommend that children spend no more than 40 hours listenchildren spend no more than 40 hours listening to a personal audio device per week, at
levels no higher than 75 decibels, to prevent hearing damage. Many technology devices hearing damage. Many technology devices
and accessories reach volumes above 100 decibels, and even headphones marketed as "kid safe" routinely exceed 85 or even 90 decibels. This makes ongoing vigilance important. Puna advises that the following simple Turn the volume down (even on "s
