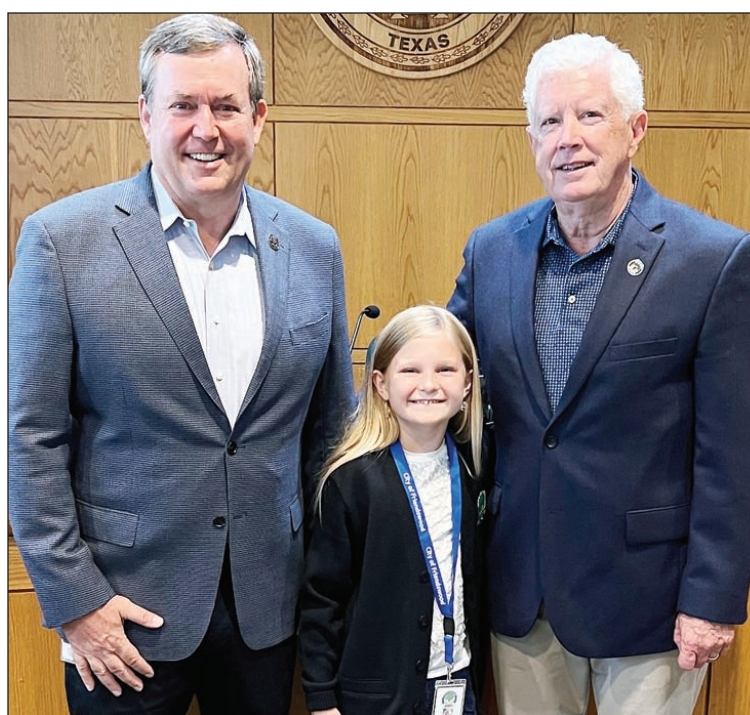

Water wisely during Dog Days of Summer

It is currently the Dog Days of Summer. This year they occur from July 3 to August 11. The dates coincide with the rising of Sirius, the Dog Star. Romans referred to this period as *dies caniculares* or "days of the dog star," which was eventually translated as just "dog days."

In ancient Greece and Rome, the Dog Days of Summer were believed to bring drought, bad luck, unrest, both

human and canine madness and extreme heat. Today Dog Days refer to the period of the summer's peak temperatures along with uncomfortable humidity. It is during this time that water is extremely important and the wise use of water will not only be efficient in the landscape but cost saving too. In most areas, 30 percent of all water is used for outdoor use. Inefficient landscape watering practices waste water and money. For lawns, water thoroughly but infrequently to help grass and shrubs develop deep roots. This helps a lawn become more drought tolerant but it should be done by adjusting slowly in successively longer periods between watering. Water early in the morning (before 10 am) so that the water will not evaporate between the sprinkler and grass before reaching the ground. If watering in the evening, do it after 5 pm. Water plants and shrubs but not the sidewalk, driveway or street.

Rainwater doesn't contain harsh chemicals and can be funneled from gutters into barrels or cisterns to use. Creating a rain barrel system can be a fun family project and it will benefit plants and shrubs. Mow grass when it is dry and cut no more than one-third the length each time. Three inches is a good height for grass during summer; it helps blades hold moisture longer, is less likely to have browning and encourages deeper roots. To conserve soil moisture, use plenty of mulch. It not only retains moisture but also reduces runoff, helps soil temperatures, aids in root development, slows weed growth, helps prevent compaction of soil and beautifies a landscape. Fertilize in spring and fall, not summer. If possible, choose plants that are drought and heat tolerant or have low water requirements. Water wise irrigation equipment is also helpful. The most efficient irrigation system for non-turf areas such as flower beds, trees and shrubs is drip irrigation. If using automatic sprinkler systems, adjust settings as needed. Not all planted areas need the same amount of water. Shady areas also may not need as much water as sunny areas. Set accordingly. If using a sprinkler system, use one that places large drops of water close to the ground. For all gardeners, stay hydrated during the Dog Days of Summer and look forward to August 12 when they are over. 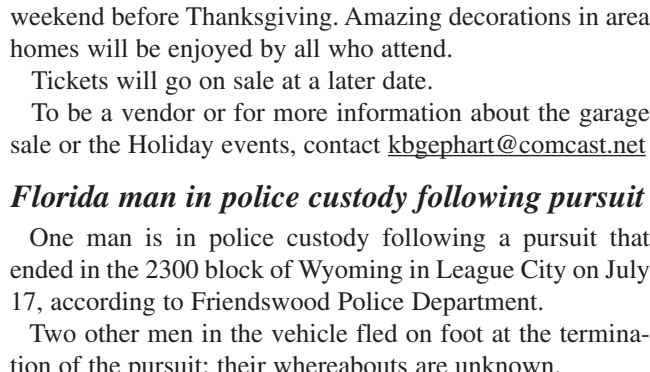

Florida man in police custody following pursuit

One man is in police custody following a pursuit that ended in the 2300 block of Wyoming in League City on July 17, according to Friendswood Police Department. Two other men in the vehicle fled on foot at the termination of the pursuit; their whereabouts are unknown. All three men are believed to be part of the "Felony Lane Gang" from Florida. Now in custody, Cedric Cornelius Camper, 24, was in a vehicle with stolen Texas license plates and had just committed a vehicle burglary at Challenger Park. Camper is charged with Evading Arrest or Detention in a Motor Vehicle, Possession of a Controlled Substance, and Fraudulent Use or Possession of Identifying Information. He sustained an ankle injury when he stepped into a hole while trying to flee from police. He was taken to the hospital to treat his injury and released back into police custody. The vehicle contained stolen credit cards, driver's licenses, marijuana, and methamphetamine.

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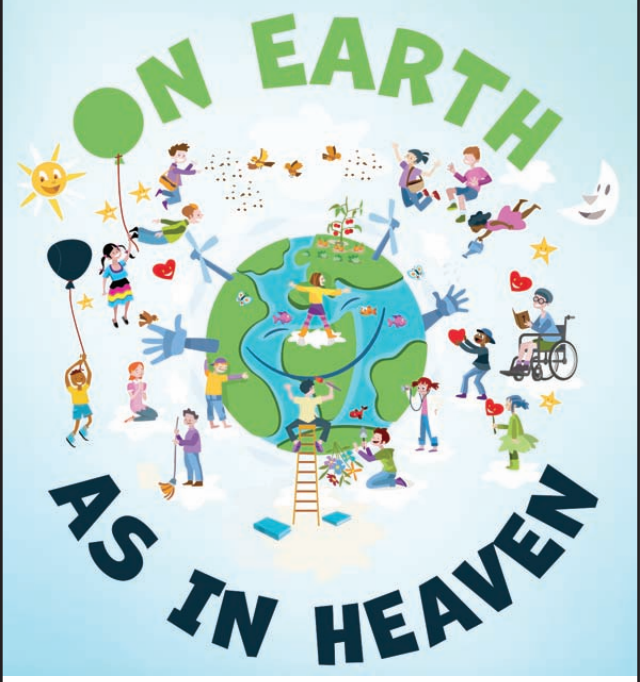

Lighthouse provides focus
A ship was lost in the fog, the darkness of the night. The captain saw a light directly in front of them.



Thinking it was another vessel...he sent a message - "Change your course 10 degrees to the north."

A message came back, "Change your course 10 degrees to the south."

A little incensed, the captain sent a second message, "Sir, this is the captain speaking. Change your course 10 degrees to the north!"

The clear, calm reply came back, "Sir, this is a Seaman First Class speaking. "Change your course 10 degrees to the south."

Now the irate captain sent a third message. "Sir! This is a battleship! Change your course 10 degrees to the north!"

The third message returned slowly and clearly, "Sir, this is a lighthouse. Change your course 10 degrees to the south."

Change is certainly a big part of life; it is all around us. We have the choice of being open to change or staying the same as we have always been. But there is one tendency. That is to expect change out of others, but not ourselves. We tend to set standards by which others should change to measure up to our expectations.

Often children may seem to be openly rebellious as the seaman in the lighthouse, but if we were to stop and listen, we might find a level of growth that would truly astound us in the lives of our children.

Notice that the seaman did not declare his position immediately. This is often the case in a situation where communication is vague. Even though the captain was sincere in his thinking...he was sincerely wrong!

This may not always be the case with teens, but there must be a level of acceptance and an attempt to communicate the proper information when change is needed or requested. The key is listening and then following up with patient guidance. Our children will change! But our task, as parents, is to guide that change on an acceptable course.

As parents, we must be open to change in every area of our lives - not only in ourselves, but in our children as well. Just as a child has not advanced beyond their present age, it is important that, as parents, we, too, have not been this way before with our children. As painful as it may be, "Change is often the yardstick by which growth is measured."

It is not unreasonable for us to be open and honest with our children. A child says, "Why?" - it should be an opportunity for a parent to open the lines of communication with more than - "Because I said so." This is confusing to a child and does not advance the relationship between the parent and the child.

Has it ever occurred to you that perhaps the child will respond to a future request if he or she knows that they will be given a simple explanation of why the parent is asking them to do or not to do a certain thing?

When a parent exercises their authority without respect for the child...then rebellion - not obedience is being built into that child. A little tenderness and love is always the best remedy to build up a child's life. Try it! It will make a difference as you grow together in your parent/child relationship.

Old friend Robert said, "There are places in your heart you never knew existed until you love a baby. A baby will make your days shorter, love stronger, bankroll smaller, clothes shabbier, home happier, the past forgotten, and the future worth living for."

New coach, vision, excitement characterizes Pearland football

When Pearland concluded spring football practice with their Spring Game, a casual observer familiar with the Oilers could immediately see a new energy and enthusiasm was evident from the coaching staff and players.

There was a whole new atmosphere that permeated the stadium as the Maroon Team faced the White Team.

However, there were also the cheerleaders, members of the band, and a lot of fans watching with excitement and anticipation that has been missing for the past couple of years.

New head coach B.J. Gotte has already orchestrated new life in the Pearland football program that is being felt by the entire Pearland team and student body.

Gotte replaced Ricky Tullos, who left Pearland after four seasons for Bryan High in mid-January. Tullos went 33-11 as head coach of the Oilers while posting a 1-4 record in the post-season.

Fresh from winning the Class 5A Div. I state championship at Katy Paetow, Gotte began his new journey with the Oilers that includes an impressive coaching resume that includes four state titles as an assistant coach at Katy (2003, 2012, 2015) and La Marque (2006) and one as a head coach at Katy Paetow in 2021.

As the Oilers face the 2022 football season, they will focus on continuing their playoff streak while getting back to making a deeper run in the playoffs that has been missing for the past four years.

The non-district schedule for the Oilers will be a challenge that will set them up to make a run for the District 23-6A crown. The pre-season prediction has the Oilers in third place behind Shadow Creek and Dawson, but Gotte knows that games are won on the field and not on paper.

Pearland will begin the Gotte era on Friday,

August 26 at Veterans Stadium against Clear Falls at 7:00 p.m. Clear Falls was 9-2 last season while advancing to the 6A Div. II bi-district after finishing in second place in the 24-6A standings behind Dickinson.

The Oilers will take on a familiar opponent in the Spring Branch Memorial Mustangs on



NEW LEADERSHIP FOR PEARLAND FOOTBALL: New head coach B.J. Gotte has already orchestrated new life in the Pearland football program that is being felt by the entire coaching staff and Pearland players. The 2022 football season is going to be filled with excitement and expectancy.

Thursday, Sept. 1 at 6:00 p.m. at The Rig. Memorial beat Pearland last year 17-14 in a rare win. The Mustangs went on to post a 7-5 mark while advancing to the 6A Div II area-round.

Closing out the non-district schedule will be against C.E. King on Friday, Sept. 9 at Panther Stadium at 7:00 p.m. The Panthers were 10-3 in 2021 and advanced to the 6A Div II regional semifinals. C. E. King may be in one of the most challenging districts where they have to compete against North Shore, Atascocita, and Summer Creek. The Panthers are a pre-season third place district selection.

Pearland has six offensive and three defensive starters returning with 26 lettermen to begin the 2022 football season from a 7-4

team in 2021.

Leading the offense will be RB Kennedy Lewis (5-8, 175, 4.6) who rushed for 552 yards and scored seven TDs last season. WR Christian Pitts (5-10, 155, 4.6) proved last season that he is a multi-talented athlete as he had (12 carries rushing for 249 yards and 1 TD; 26 catches for 331 yards and 3 scores; 330 kickoff return yards; 118 punt return yards). Both Lewis and Pitts have the talent to play at the next level.

Junior WR Patrick Bridges (6-1, 175, 4.7) will be another offensive weapon that showed a lot of talent to make an impact on offense while sophomore QB Jackson Hamilton (5-11, 170, 4.8) will take the offensive controls after seeing limited duty last season with 232 passing and 3 TDs. Jackson's dad is the QB coach for the Houston Texans. The young Hamilton already has received several college offers so he will only get better as he grows and matures athletically.

Others who will contribute on offense include: OL Aidan Demmon (6-3, 270), OL Christian Argo, TE Joseph Garcia, WR Aiden Gasper, TE J.J. Wheeler, and K Jackson Staggs.

Defensively, the Oilers have a young unit that will be tested early in the season.

Leading the defensive unit will be All-District LB Zander Winter (6-2, 200, 4.6) who had 45 solo tackles, 20 assisted tackles, 4 TFL, 5 sacks, and 9 QB hurries last season. Joining him will be DB Ashton Hampton (2 INTs) and CB Gabriel Sheppard (5-8, 140, 4.5) in the secondary.

Others on defense who will need to step up include: DL Abraham Diaz (6-0, 230), CB Lazarus Range, DB Cole Anderson, and LB Matthew Lumpkin.

LIFE IN THE SPIRIT

“When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2 Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues[a] as the Spirit enabled them. – Acts 2:1-4

I participate in a ZOOM Bible study every Monday morning. I don't lead it... I'm just one of the guys who logs on and shares in the conversation. It's good for me. People come and go in this virtual gathering from California to Florida and Canada to Texas. I've never met them in person... but we consider this "church" and the focus today was recalling the first "Pentecost" ... the 50th day after Easter...the day the whole Church claims to be our 'birthday!'

For on that day Peter preached. He was accused of being drunk. Yet in a sober response, Peter preached on and 3,000 people were baptized! Would you hang around a church worship service that had 3,000 baptisms? Then St. Luke reported in the Acts of the Apostles... *“And they dedicated themselves to the apostle's teachings, the prayers, the fellowship, the breaking of the bread. And the Lord ADDED to their numbers those who were being saved.”* Awesome, huh? It seems the early church wasn't advocating an acceptance of a personal relationship with Jesus Christ but rather, they were intentional about building community! Life in the Spirit created a life together! This is what Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote about 'life together' in a book by the same title... *“Those who love their dream of a Christian community more than the Christian community itself become destroyers of that Christian community even though their personal intentions may be ever so honest, earnest, and sacrificial.”* Whoah! Sometimes... I hear others speak ill-will of the Church... words like 'judgmental' and 'too moral.' Or 'the church is too busy pointing out other people's errors than tending to the building up of people's

lives.' You may have heard similar words or even said them yourself. I get that. But, I also contend that over the course of my 20+ years as a pastor in Pearland we live in a time where there is more confusion than ever over the nature and work of Christ's church... so let me try this ...

1) Christians either believe that 'all have fallen short of the glory of God' or we don't—it's personal!

2) If we do... then we all are in the same boat and in need of God's grace and one another's support!

3) Then, we can either be helpful, supportive and participate... or... remove ourselves from community and the caring of our neighbors.

4) So, the church exists, then, not to instruct people to not sin. (*Read that again!*) The church exists to point others to the God who loves, welcomes and forgives us despite our sins... or as St. Paul once wrote... *“let me show you a more excellent way...”* as we are saved, then, by grace, and can't boast of our own works!

And then begins the essential task of building community in the power of the Spirit and being the hands of feet of Christ in the world. God knows the world isn't the defining force of life... with divisions and wars and rumors of wars... with homeless, hungry and victims of injustice all over the planet.

So, while you get to the middle of Summer... take a moment to ask God to blow a new wind into each of us and into the church! Let us work at building community so others will know how good God is... dedicating our lives to the apostle's teaching, the prayers, the fellowship and the breaking of the bread... knowing when we do these things God will reveal that perfect and preferred future we all seek! Faith matters.
