## FISD Education Foundation hosts record-breaking 'A Night At The Derby' Gala

The Friendswood ISD Education Foundation (FEF) hosted its 2023 Gala, A Night at the Derby, Saturday, Feb. 25 at the Galveston Island Convention Center at the San Luis Resort. The Derby-themed celebration brought together more than 700 guests and netted a record-breaking \$400,000+.

The event, chaired by Tracy Hopkins, transported guests to Churchill Downs with Kentucky Derby signature cocktails, a Southern-inspired menu and a trifecta of great fellowship, entertainment and fun, all while rallying around the Foundation's mission.

"The FEF Gala is more than an awesome party with more than 700 of FISD's closest friends," Friendswood ISD Superintendent Thad Roher said. "It is evidence of what a community connected to each other and a mission can do together."

Upon entering the ballroom, guests were invited to purchase a grant at a 16' X 66' interactive display featuring the Kentucky Derby-famous Twin Spires, starting gates and six horses and jockeys designed by the Friendswood High School Art Department.

Every inch of the event was adorned with beautiful decor that perfectly captured the committee's vision of putting a vintage twist on the traditional Derby theme.

The silent auction, chaired by Amie Bell

and Victoria Merkys, featured over 100 one-of-a-kind packages and achieved record-breaking success, bringing in over \$83,000 in addition to more than \$5,000 raised through the pre-event Party Perk auction.

"Amie and Vicki excellently led the Auction Committee to bring about the most beautifully curated auction that blew all previous records out of the water," Hopkins said.

The live auction raised \$95,000 and featured everything from 10 suite tickets for the Texas A&M vs. Alabama game, to a VIP Kentucky Derby experience complete with seats on Millionaires Row and a stay at the iconic and exclusive Brown Hotel. The live auction was followed by the paddle raise where guests were invited to join the race and pledged over \$78,000 in donations directly to the Foundation's Adopt-A-Grant campaign.

The race ended with live music from Plush Party Band who closed out the record-breaking night in style, dressed in full Derby attire.

The tremendous success of this year's event would not have been possible without the generous support of Gala Title Sponsor PBK Architects.

## Three groups honored for receiving awards

Three awards were highlighted and celebrated at the recent meeting of Friendswood City Council on March 6.

For the ninth consecutive year, the Friendswood Library has received the *Texas Municipal Library Directors Association Achievement of Library Excellence Award*. The Friendswood Library is among 73 out of 542 public library systems to achieve this distinction for 2022 in the State of Texas. This makes the library in the top 15 percent of all public libraries in the state, according to TMLDA President Dennis Quinn.

The second award showcased was won by the City. The City of Friendswood received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for fiscal year 2020-2021. The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.

This is the 34th consecutive year the Administrative Services Department has been recognized with this outstanding achievement. Council recognized the efforts of Katina Hampton, Director of Administrative Services, Rhonda Bloskas, Deputy Director of Administrative Services - Finance, the accounting staff, and the entire Administrative Services Department. Their cumulative efforts enabled the City to earn this achievement. The Certificate of Achievement is the

highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.

Keep Friendswood Beautiful was the third group to be honored for achieving an award. Keep Texas Beautiful (KTB), a statewide grassroots environmental and community improvement non-profit organization, recently named Keep Friendswood Beautiful a Gold Star Affiliate, a designation granted to 70 affiliates of KTB's nearly 300 affiliates. Gold Star recognition is the membership recognition highest status any community affiliate can achieve.

In 2004, the organization introduced the concept of Gold Star recognition to reward those communities who sought to go above and beyond the established requirements. To remain in good standing with KTB, community affiliates must submit a report, pay dues, attend training, and participate in a KTB-endorsed activity annually. To achieve Gold Star status, affiliates must share information on their mission and goals, answer questions about their economic development and diversity and inclusion practices or participate in the Beautify Texas Awards or Governor's Community Achievement Awards programs and provide a letter of support from their community. KTB will formally recognize Gold Star communities during its 55th Annual Conference in June.

## Lady Oilers dominate All-District basketball selections

The Pearland Lady Oilers basketball team set a new PHS season record at 35-4 while winning the District 23-6A title (12-0), the Class 6A Region III crown while advancing to the 6A state semifinals.

The district coaches recently voted on the All-District teams, and it was no surprise that the Lady Oilers would dominate the district honors.

Voted as the "Coach of the Year" was Pearland's second-year head coach Jere' Adams who has a two-year 63-14 record while leading the Lady Oilers to the 6A state semifinals. Pearland's last appearance in the state basketball tournament was in 1980 when the Lady Oilers were in Class 4A 43-years ago.

Of course her coaching staff of Andre Stokes, Corey Grays, and Damita Hampton play an important role in Pearland's success.

Named as the 23-6A "Most Valuable Player" was Pearland senior RyLee Grays. The McDonald's All-American nomi-

nee and North Carolina commit scored 648 total points (16.6 ppg), 416 rebounds, 57 assists, 69 steals, and 46 blocks.

Pearland players named to the All-District first-team were: junior La'Niah Thornton (276 points [7.1 ppg], 165 rebounds, 29 assists, 40 steals), and junior Nyah Hardy (395 points [10.1 ppg], 116

Dawson was a very competitive team under head coach Sharee Griffin as they finished 16-18 overall and 5-7 in district while barely missing the post-season.

Solis pitched seven frames, allowed seven hits, two runs while striking out four and walking four to get the win.

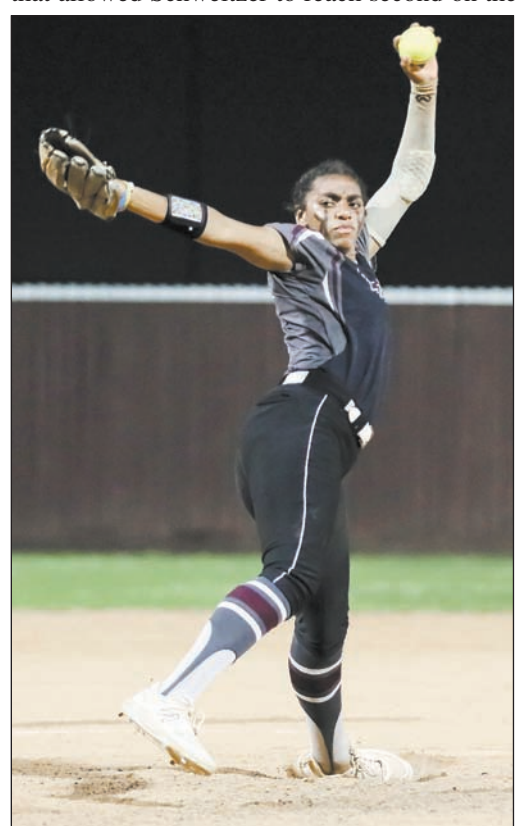

## Martin returns to the helm of the Manvel football program

Kirk Martin was named head football coach for the Manvel Mavericks in 2006 when the school opened for the Alvin ISD school district. He was the head coach from 2006 to 2017 and compiled an impressive 108-25 coaching record that included two state title game appearances (2011, 2017) while also advancing to five regional finals (2010, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016).

Now, in 2023 Martin has returned as the Head Coach/Assistant AD for Manvel once again.

"I helped open up Manvel and I have so many great memories here," Martin said. "Four kids here and I'm just ecstatic to get the opportunity to come back home. This is home. This is where my kids are from. It's where I'm from. It's just home."

"This is the very best district in the country in my opinion. I'm so excited to be able to come back here and finish what I started. I love it and I just can't wait to get rolling with those kids and get back in that Hoka Hey spirit."

In 2017, Martin departed Manvel for Syracuse University where he became the quarterback coach for two years. He returned to Texas in 2020 to become head

coach for Grapevine Colleyville Heritage where he guided them to a 28-7 mark with playoff appearances in all three seasons including a region finalist appearance in 2021.

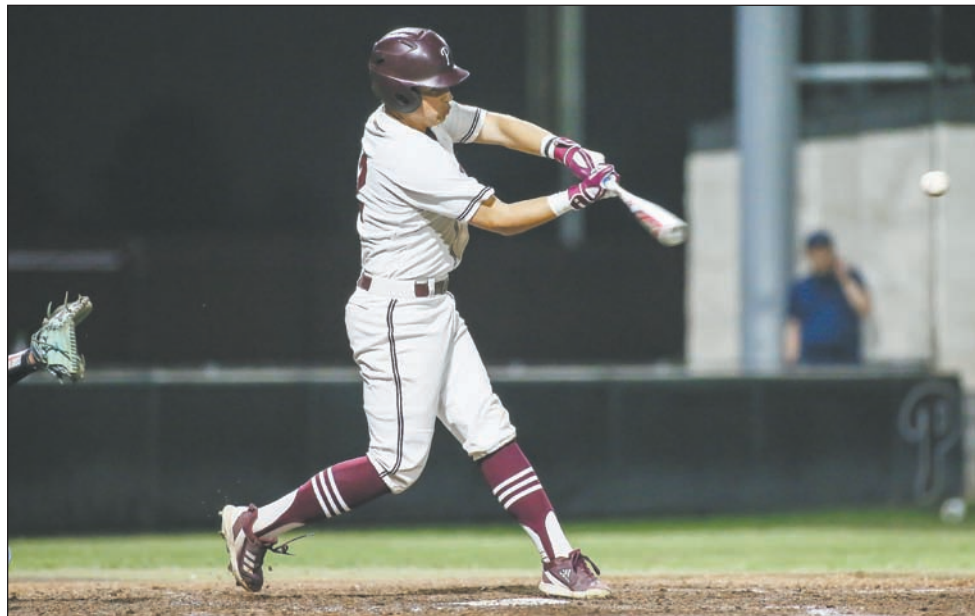
Martin's first game back at Manvel will ironically come against former assistant Brad Butler's Shadow Creek Sharks with the second annual Bill Lewis/HWY 288 Gridiron Classic opening the season for area squads at Freedom Field.

"I heard about last year," Martin said. "They basically sold the thing (stadium) out and I wouldn't expect it to be any different. I helped design the stadium but didn't get to coach in it (until next fall). That will be really fun to be in that state-of-the-art facility. It's a special place."

Martin started his coaching career in 1993 at Cathedral High School and helped them to their first winning season in 12 years, while a three-year stay at 5A El Paso Riverside featured three district championships. He held the same position under Ron Lynch (1996-97) at Alvin High School and was later the assistant head coach under Mike Bass (1998-2000) here.

Martin then served as the passing coordinator at Odessa Permian (2000-

2003), the offensive coordinator at 3A Giddings (2003) and took his initial head coaching job at 2A Alpine (2004-2006) before coming to Manvel


