# Schools Museum Hall of Fame inducts 4

Two Friendswood couples were recently inducted into the Friendswood Schools Museum as new members of the Cesar J. Galli Above and Beyond Hall of Fame. The prestigious award is given to people who are local unsung heroes who went above and beyond to make Mustang Years for local youth the best times they could be.


Ed and Vernelle Hoskins along with Jess and Annette Williams were the couples honored. Vernell Hoskins attended the ceremony and Ed along with both Williams received the award posthumously. Family members and friends of both groups were there to congratulate the

family members. The induction ceremony was October 7 at the Friendswood Schools Museum on Spreading Oaks in Friendswood.

Throughout the mid to late 1970s, Jess and Annette Williams were always finding ways to contribute to the City of Friendswood and, in particular, their beloved Mustangs. Beyond her substitute teaching duties, for several years Annette was the driving force behind fundraising "pre-game" spaghetti dinners (using her own recipe). In addition, when funds were needed to pave the gravel (mud) parking lot at the high school, Annette devised a plan to start charging for parking during the football games and other special events. Annette stood in the parking lot



ing, Jess stepped up with a borrowed machine to paint parking stripes on the newly blacktopped parking lot. Jess was also the treasurer and one of the founders of the Friendswood Little League, as well as a treasurer for many years at the Friendswood Historical Society. For their parents' many contributions, the children of Jess and Annette Williams accepted their award.

Ed and Vernelle Hoskins played an integral part in FHS Musicals from the early 1970s through the mid 1980s.

After serving in the US Air Force, Ed and his wife Vernelle Hoskins set their sights on serving Friendswood High School, the school from which their seven children would graduate. Ed teamed up with other Aggies to build life-sized replicas of the football players and build sets for many of the musicals. One of which he was especially proud was the house structure from the musical Oklahoma in 1974. This house set was used for many years.

Vernelle, like many other parents in Friendswood in the 70s and 80s, committed her extra time to making, repairing, and redesigning costumes to fit the time-periods of the each musical. She made herself available for not only her own children, but for many other students in the FHS musicals who needed help with costumes.

- Genesis 6:5-8

The Christian Bible has two main parts... the first having 39 books from the Hebrew scriptures... which is referred to as the Old Testament and the other part is called the new one... a New Testament with 27 books mirroring the older ones... with hundreds of years between the end of one and the beginning of the other. Religious folks called this material... holy and inspired by God... and in my tribe... the Lutherans... we say that these words are trustworthy, faithful and normative for daily life. 

Only one time has Pearland scored more than 70 points in a game against an opponent and that was on October 15, 2015, when the Oilers blanked the Sam Rayburn Texans 72-0. Last week, Pearland traveled to Memorial Stadium where they faced the Alvin Yellow-

jackets in a district contest and returned home with a lopsided 73-0 victory that set a new team record for points scored in a single game while also improving their 2023 season record to 5-1 and 3-0 in league action.

The Oilers have been improving each week in a dramatic way and the hard work of the coaching staff and players continues to reap dividends in a big way.

Pearland scored five times in the first 12 minutes to build a 35-0 lead over the Jackets.

Pearland head coach B.J. Gotte emptied the bench and the Oilers scored two more time in the final period as Josiah Davis crossed the goal line on a 3-yard run and senior Diego Linares booted a 39-yard field goal with 4:26 left in the game to put the finishing touches on the 73-0 district win.

Yuping Li on Sept. 7 received a lifelong revocation and is barred from future employment in the massage industry for allowing an employee to engage in inappropriate contact at the business, employing an unlicensed person and allowing an employee to reside on the property, according to TDLR. ## **Help Construct Pearland's Cultural Arts Master Plan**

Pearland residents are invited to participate in the creation of the city's first Cultural Arts Master Plan through a variety of opportunities hosted by the Pearland Convention and Visitors Bureau (PCVB).

Residents and stakeholders are encouraged to attend the team meet-and-greet at the West Pearland Library on Tuesday, October 24 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. followed by a critical community discussion on Wednesday, October 25 at the Horizon Montessori School Theater from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.

The arts contribute to economic growth, support local businesses, and attract visitors to our city," said Tracy Rohr-bacher, executive director of the PCVB. "Community perspective is instrumental in the planning process; input from a variety of audiences, including residents, will guide the future of arts and culture here in Pearland."

The entire process is being guided by Cultural Planning Group (CPG), a national firm that specializes in developing cultural arts plans for cities and counties. They are committed to creating a plan by, with, and for the arts and culture communities of Pearland.

The project kicked off in August with tours of Pearland's cultural destinations by the PCVB and CPG, and with a meeting of the Cultural Arts Master Plan steering committee to set objectives and develop strategies for the plan. The committee consists of various community members representing a diversity of perspectives from across the city with a focus on engagement and insight to harness emerging opportunities and overcome longstanding challenges.

"The goal is to emerge from this process of discussion and designing with a proper roadmap," Rohrbacher continued. "A plan to nurture the existing arts and culture community in Pearland and to stimulate the growth and success of new projects and events."

## **Certain Medicaid Recipients Get Additional Time to Complete Packets**

The Texas Health and Human Services Commission is providing certain Medicaid recipients an additional 30 days to complete their renewal packets. As part of the unwinding of continuous Medicaid coverage, the federal government is requiring HHSC to redetermine Medicaid eligibility for approximately 6 million Texans over a 12-month period.

'We continue to work tirelessly to renew Medicaid for those who are eligible and to help those who still need assistance get connected to the resources they need," said HHS Executive Commissioner Cecile Erwin Young. "We hope this additional time will help those who need it to respond to their renewal applications to avoid potential gaps in coverage."

Medicaid recipients who are eligible to receive additional time to complete their renewals were notified on or around Oct. 10 via mail or posted electronically in their Your Texas Benefits account. Individuals who receive this additional time are most likely to remain eligible for Medicaid coverage, such as older adults and people with disabilities.

HHSC is now more than halfway through the Medicaid redetermination process. The agency has initiated Medicaid redeterminations for 3.5 million Texans, or 59% of the state's Medicaid population. As it continues to carry out the renewal process for the remaining 41%, HHSC is focused on a targeted outreach campaign for Medicaid's intellectual or developmental disability (IDD) population, school-aged children and the aging community.

HHSC has implemented multiple technologies to help Medicaid recipients more easily access their online applications and update their information. Medicaid recipients are now able to monitor the status of their application online or through their Your Texas Benefits mobile application. Mobile users can update their Your Texas Benefits app to access this upgrade. In addition to routine renewal communications, HHSC is overseeing a robust public education campaign across social media platforms including a digital advertising campaign that has reached nearly 2 million users from Oct. 13, 2022. to Aug. 31, 2023. HHSC has hosted eight in-person renewal assistance events across the state in collaboration with the Community Partner Program, Feeding Texas and local food banks. These pop-up events are specifically designed to guide customers through the renewal of their benefits, offering onthe-ground support and assistance to address any questions they may have about the process and eliminate the need to visit a local office or make calls to the 2-1-1 helpline. In anticipation of the increase in workload, HHSC has provided frontline eligibility advisors up to a 25% salary increase, which has improved retention among current staff and strengthened recruitment efforts to further boost eligibility operations capacity. Those strategies have reduced the vacancy rate for eligibility advisors from 21.23% in March 2022 to 3.84% in August 2023. HHSC has developed quality assurance processes to quickly identify and address issues that arise during the unwinding period. The agency continues to implement federally approved waivers and other flexibilities to assist in the unwinding effort, including electronically updating Medicaid recipient addresses and using recent SNAP income data to confirm Medicaid eligibility. In September, HHSC also implemented a new federally approved waiver to allow managed care organizations to help recipients with their renewal applications.
